We now have more functionality and use this to make your experience with the International Club much easier and convenient. We are excited to announce that we have now introduced the ability to accept payments from our membership online via our website using a secure and convenient online payments service, STRIPE.

Anybody interested in joining the ICS will be able to complete their
membership application online and pay their joining fee using their VISA or MASTERCARD on our
secure payments system. In January, when annual membership renewals are due, members can
use the online payments system to pay their membership renewal, quickly

Naturally we are using an industry recognized secure payments system and have the vital SSL certificate which assures anyone using the payments system that it is safe and secure. You will see the green padlock and HTTPS in your web browser to reassure you that it is completely secure and encrypted transaction.

Not only will the online payments system make it much easier, more secure

and convenient for you to make payments to the ICS, but if a refund is necessary on a payment made by VISA or MASTERCARD using the system, we can quickly and easily make any refund to you too.

Of course, we can still accept payments in cash for membership and trips, but we hope that the ability to make secure payments online will greatly improve your experience with the club.

INTRODUCING ONLINE BOOKING

The trips and events that the International Club organise are amongst the top-ranking benefits of club membership.

We have great interest in our trips and events. At present many of our members are able to book their places for them in person at one of our weekly meetings at the Hotel Salobreña Suites, paying cash. However, it's clear that many members would enjoy the flexibility to book places online and then pay online. This is particularly useful when they're not able to attend in person for some time of the year.

Our new website offers the ability and opportunity to book and pay online to make your experience with the ICS as secure, simple and convenient as possible. We have introduced a booking page where you have a one-stop-shop to see which trips are planned and taking bookings. You can also see what information we need from you to be able to complete your booking.

You will see a short online form to enable you to give us the information we need. It's a completely user -friendly form, completely secure and information held inline with the club's GDPR data protection rules. Typically, we need full name, email address, mobile number if available, which trip is required, confirmation of membership. We can also capture useful information like dietary requirements, preferred pick up location, accommodation requirements, depending on the type of trip and options available.

To make sure everything is as accurate as possible, it's important that a form is completed for each person booking a place on a trip or event.

There are three stages to trip booking:

Booking Form Submission – You complete the simple, secure online form. When submitted you receive

an email confirming your booking has been sent to the committee member looking after that trip/event.

- **Availability Check** The committee member looking after that trip/event check space is available and that they can comply with your booking requirements. They then send you an email confirming your reservation pending payment. You will be given details of how and when to pay.
- **Booking Payment** You then simply make payment for the booking either in cash or using our secure online payments system. Once we have confirmed that we have received your payment your booking is confirmed and all you need to do is sit back and look forward to a great trip or event!

IMPORTANT – Your booking is only finalised when we have confirmed space available and booking payment has been received and acknowledged by the organizing Committee member.

This month we have a short story of heroism, kindly submitted by our very own dedicated Vocal and all-round Quiz-Genius, Giles Killick. If you like the story, why not drop us a line... we would love to hear from you.

Who was the hero?

In the early hours of 12 April 1961, from the Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan, the Russians launched Vostok 1, a spacecraft carrying Yuri Gagarin – the first human to travel in space and the first to orbit the earth.



The USSR and the USA had been working hard, competing over many years, to be the first to put a human into space. The Americans and the rest of the world were stunned – not only had the Russians beaten the Americans to put a human into space – they had been able to bring him back – alive and unharmed.

Gagarin had been, for the most part, a spectator on the journey – the ascent and descent of his spacecraft was under the control of the people on the ground. And the real challenge was not so much shooting Gagarin into space, and not just getting him back, but getting him back to a place that was in Russian controlled territory and was a reasonable distance from where his rocket had been launched.

The Russians had designated a target landing area in Kazkhstan, within a 320km/200mile radius of the launch area. A target spot that was the rough equivalent of one-five-thousandth of the surface area of the planet around which Uri Gagarin was circling.

The most difficult and most critical task for the Russians on the ground, was to ensure that they pressed the button that would fire the rockets on Gagarin's capsule at the only precise split-second available that would ensure the capsule would be on the correct trajectory to return Gagarin to the target area on Earth. Even just a fraction of a second too early or too late could put Gagarin's return to earth thousands of kilometers away from what was planned – perhaps even into mountains or the sea.

So, how did these Russian scientists calculate the exact moment when Gagarin's capsule had to be fired-up to return to earth? Well, they were able to do it because they had the benefit of being able to use and apply the universally accepted research and theories on gravity and calculus that had been developed as early as 1666 – some 300 years earlier, by a 26 year-old Englishman by the name of Isaac Newton.

Isaac Newton is my choice of hero of this story.




